Every quarter, the French Institute of the North Shore offers its students a tasting of various culinary specialties from France.

As summer approaches, the French look forward to sipping a glass of *vin rosé* while enjoying their view from a café. A good *rosé* wine is the perfect way to savor the longer days and warm weather. Contrary to popular belief, *rosé* is not a mix of red and white wine, and this practice is actually forbidden in France. *Rosé* wine is fermented differently than red wine in that the skin of the red grapes is left in contact with the nearly colorless grape juice for only a few hours, giving it a light pink color. Traditionally served chilled, *le vin rosé* will be sampled in class this May, and we hope you enjoy it as much as the French do!

# COURSE DESCRIPTIONS: PRINTEMPS/Spring 2018

#### **FRENCH FOR TRAVELERS** Dreaming of a *compe* of champange next to the River Seine? Learn the essentials to make your trip to France more enjoyable. Students learn how to comfortablely communicate in every day and travel-related situations.

#### Level 1

*Consists of three consecutive quarters* This beginning course introduces students to the essentials of the French language and culture. Learn practical vocabulary, key verbs in present, immediate future and past tense; how to form questions; and communicate effectively in typical situations encountered by travelers.

#### ${\rm Level} \ 2$

Consists of three consecutive quarters Learn more extensive vocabulary, how to use and distinguish between the past and imperfect tenses. Study the necessary grammar to easily use more complex sentence structures and communicate in a variety of challenging everyday situations. Interesting cultural topics will also be discussed..

### Level 3

Consists of three consecutive quarters This level introduces the future, conditional and subjunctive tenses. Increased vocabulary, including more idioms, coupled with advanced grammar structure enables students to communicate with greater ease upon completion of this course. Interesting cultural topics will also be discussed.

## Prêt-à-Parler Levels 1, 2 & 3

This course is complementary to the group level classes. Students improve their verbal expression and practice using vocabulary, all while reinforcing key points from the group level classes and keeping up to date on happenings in France.

### Level 4 Grammar

Consists of 6 consecutive quarters This is a 2 year grammar course, ideal for students looking for the next progressive step to perfect their language skills. While Level 4 is different from previous levels, it builds on concepts learned in Levels 1, 2 and 3. Students acquire complex grammar structures and improve both oral and written expression. A text is required.

### level 4 Conversation

Taken after completion of, or during, current enrollment in Level 4 Using current events and cultural topics, students will put the grammar concepts learned in Level 4 into practice. This is an intermediate conversation course, designed to advance students' listening comprehension, and expand students' vocabulary and awareness of contemporary French and Francophone culture.

### Conversation Levels 5 & 6

Using newspaper and magazine articles, and televised news as a starting point for discussion about contemporary French culture, this advanced conversation class expands students' vocabulary and repertoire of idiomatic expressions, improves students' listening comprehension and refines verbal expression.

#### Advanced Grammar Levels 5/6

This is an advanced grammar course for students who already have a strong command of the French language and want to fine-tune their speech. This class reviews common mistakes made by English speakers that distinguish them as non-native French speakers. Please note this is not a conversation class, however oral exercises will be used throughout the quarter. A text is required.

#### Literature Levels Five/Six

Written when the author was eighty-three years old, but dealing with only the first twelve years of her life, Enfance is constructed as a dialogue between Sarraute and her memory. Her relationships with her mother in Russia and her stepmother in Paris are especially heartbreaking: longgone actions are prodded and poked at by Sarraute until they vield some semblance of fact. Capturing the ambience of Paris and Russia in the earliest part of the twentieth century, Sarraute maintains the lyrical writing style for which she is well known. This book has much to offer to both memoir enthusiasts and fiction lovers.
